#### Special Presentations

1. To help guide the workgroup's focus on developing a data wish list for family outcomes, representatives from ISDH and DCS joined the meeting to share home visiting data from their respective programs;
2. Shirley Payne, ISDH, gave an overview of the [Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting](#) (MIECHV) funding, including the [Nurse Family Partnership](#) program;
3. Cynthia Smith shared an overview of [Healthy Families Indiana](#), which is a home visiting program available in all 92 Indiana counties and focuses on prevention and family outcomes;
4. Both presentations will be shared via email and posted to Wiggio for workgroup members' review.

#### Family Engagement Collaboration

1. Co-chairs of the ELAC Family Engagement workgroup, Katie Herron and John Peirce, joined the workgroup to assist with the brainstorming session of desired family outcomes;
2. They shared the process their workgroup used last year to outline desired family engagement data, as well as the discovery that much of the data did not exist;
3. Examples of data they were looking to collect included: chronic absenteeism, parent-child reading time, and parent engagement, largely because they were more "tangible" family engagement data points. While data on these indicators existed, they were not usable due to low reliability and validity.

#### Family Outcomes Data List

1. As a continuation of the discussion in June, the workgroup brainstormed a "wish list" of family outcome data that, in a perfect world, they would be able to collect. Below is the uncategorized list:
  - a. Valuing child's school work (i.e. displaying artwork around the house)



- b. Family stability (i.e. # of houses/job changes/changes in family structure)
- c. Transition from home visiting programs (Healthy Families Indiana; Nurse-Family Partnership) to high-quality early learning program
- d. Attendance
- e. Language/Literacy at home (i.e number of children's books present, possession of an active library card, 30-million-word gap: talking, singing, reading)
- f. Participation in kindergarten transition programs (beyond registration)
- g. Paid family leave (being home with child in first 6-12 weeks)
- h. Medical home
- i. Completion of developmental screen
- j. Parent knowledge of child development / milestones
- k. Two-generation outcome (parent education)
- l. ACES / toxic stress
- m. Parent attitude toward school / education
- n. Parent knowledge about PTQ / high-quality early learning programs
- o. Percentage (%) or number (#) of children ages birth – 5 in poverty that are participating in home visiting and/or a high-quality program
- p. Home education
- q. Engagement in parent-teacher conferences
- r. Regular sharing of child's progress (leads to increase in family engagement)
- s. Parent nurturing of child – using HFI's CHEERS (Cues, Holding, Expression, Empathy, Rhythmicity Reciprocity, Smiles)
- t. Nutrition
- u. Shared family meals
- v. Screen time

2. At the next meeting, the workgroup will start to synthesize and categorize the list.

### ELAC Annual Report

1. The timeline to release this year's ELAC Annual Report is October. This workgroup offered to draft a section around social-emotional development, which will be discussed at next month's meeting.
